Thursday, August 11, 2011

A special meeting of the Cody City Council was held in Council Chambers of City Hall in Cody, Wyoming on Thursday, August 11, 2011 at 4:15 p.m.

Present: Mayor Nancy Tia Brown, Council Members Steve Miller, Bryan Edwards, Donny Anderson, Jerry Fritz, and Stan Wolz, City Administrator, Jenni Rosencranse, City Attorney, Scott Kolpitcke, and Assistant Administrative Services Officer, Sara Wead

Absent: Council Member Charles Cloud

Mayor Brown called the meeting to order at 4:18 p.m.

Rick Manchester, Parks, Recreation, and Facilities Director provided a summary of the Urban Deer Task Force meetings and recommendations. Randy Blackburn discussed the use of electric fence to keep deer out of yards. Sharon LaGrant discussed having the police department track deer/vehicle collisions so that more data is available on this issue. Tim Fagan, Game & Fish explained there is not a deer population problem in terms of disease. Mick Barrus discussed the rising issue in other areas of deer attacks on humans. A committee of two Council Members and three task force members was formed to work on further specifying the recommendations. No action was taken.

Council Member Miller was appointed to participate in the City Planner assessment and interview process.

The Governing Body discussed the agenda for the Tuesday, August 16th Regular Council Meeting.

Steve Payne, Public Works Director provided an update that chip seal oil will not be available until the beginning of September and therefore the chip sealing schedule will be adjusted.

Scott Kolpitcke, City Attorney informed Council there will be a liquor committee meeting Friday, August 12th at 11:00 am. Liquor license holders have been invited to the meeting.

Jenni Rosencranse stated a meeting was held with the nuisance committee to continue work on the ordinance.

Council Member Miller said the bids were opened for Shoshone Municipal Pipeline. The bid will be awarded on Monday.

Council Member Anderson inquired regarding the possibility expanding the raw water system.

Council Member Fritz reported on the traffic committee meeting. Eastside School will be implementing the "Kiss and Go" system.

There being no further business to discuss, the Mayor Brown adjourned the meeting at 5:50 p.m.
