Council Proceedings
Thursday, November 1, 2012

A special meeting of the Cody City Council was held in City Council Chambers at City Hall in Cody, Wyoming on Thursday, November 1, 2012 at 4:15 p.m.

Present: Mayor Nancy Tia Brown , Council Members Steve Miller, Donny Anderson, Bryan Edwards, Charles Cloud, Jerry Fritz and Stan Wolz, City Administrator, Jenni Rosencranse, City Attorney, Scott Kolpitcke, and Administrative Services Officer, Cindy Baker.

Absent:

Mayor Brown called the meeting to order at 4:17 p.m.

Rick Manchester, Parks, Public Facilities & Recreation Director and Buck Wilkerson updated the Governing Body on the newly formed Veterans Memorial Park Committee that recently had their first meeting and discussed flying a limited number of the flags seasonally during the windy winter months at the Veterans Memorial Park. A United States flag would fly on the World War II pole at all times, as this is the highest flag pole at the Park, along with specific dates that all flags would fly during this period. Council Member Fritz requested that the Wyoming State flag be an additional flag flown at all times as well, if applicable on the same pole and underneath the US flag. Staff was directed to proceed with the recommendation of the committee, and to include the flying of the Wyoming State flag.

Council Members Charles Cloud, Steve Miller and either Bryan Edwards or Mayor Brown were appointed to the Audit Committee and will meet on November 28th from 12:00 – 1:00 for the Audit Workshop. Staff was directed to provide the entire Governing Body with a copy of the report for review and they will direct questions to the committee prior to the workshop.

Rick Manchester, Parks, Public Facilities & Recreation Director, and Doyle Stout, Recreation Supervisor discussed additional Security Cameras at the Recreation Center and provided background information and recommendations, as well as, cost from Kenco associated with this project. Discussion was held on whether there should be more cameras and/or locations outside and fund raisers to help pay for the cost. Staff was directed to defer the purchase of the cameras and proceed with a fund raising effort.

Rick Manchester, Parks, Public Facilities & Recreation Director, and Doyle Stout, Recreation Supervisor, provided the Governing Body with background information as it pertains to the “No School Day, Free Youth Admission” at the Recreation Center. Staff was directed to proceed with the recommendations for the Governing Body, which included obtaining passes for non-members in need, promoting the sale of books of passes that would then be donated back to the Recreation Center for use in this program.

Jenni Rosencranse, City Administrator and Perry Rockvam, Chief of Police discussed the Community Enforcement Officer Reorganization. Staff was directed to consider to regular part time positions and revisit a third part time position in the spring of 2013.

Steve Payne, Public Works Directed provided the Governing Body with updated information as it pertains to the snow removal programs that staff was previously directed to send out information and solicit participation in said program. The number of responses were very low and of those responding not a significant number of those who wanted to participate. Staff was directed not to move forward with this program this year, but may revisit late summer or early fall next year.

Scott Kolpitcke, City Attorney provided an update on SSBCI/WSCN. No action was taken.

Review Council Agenda for November 6, 2012. No action was taken.

In staff updates, Cindy Baker, Administrative Services Officer reminded the Council of the Board Application period that was in process for all appointments whose term ends as of December 31, 2012.

There being no further discussion, the meeting adjourned at 6:38 p.m.
